

THE SOUTHERN AFGHAN CLUB

JUDGES' CRITERIA

1. *Before taking an examination, 4 years membership of an Afghan Breed Club and involvement with the Breed and 3 recognised Breed Club training days must be attended*
2. *All applications to be sent to the Secretary*
3. *Classes judged jointly will not be counted*
4. *Where joint interest is proven, partners receive equal status in ownership*

'C' LIST

- a) To have attended an Afghan Hound Breed seminar.
- b) To have shown an interest in the Breed and to have the support of The Southern Afghan Club
- c) To have stewarded a minimum of twelve classes

'B' LIST (BREED SPECIALIST))

- a) To have attended three Afghan Hound Breed seminars
- b) To have passed a Breed Club examination
- c) To have judged a minimum of 30 classes of Afghan Hounds
- d) To have stewarded a minimum of 4 shows of not less than 4 classes
- e) To have owned and been exhibiting in the Breed for a minimum of 5 years

'B' LIST (NON SPECIALIST)

- a) To have attended three Afghan Hound Breed seminars
- b) To have passed an Afghan Hound Breed Club examination
- c) To award Challenge Certificates in one other breed
- d) To have judged a minimum of 30 classes of Afghan Hounds
- e) To have judged Afghan Hounds over a minimum period of 5 years

C.C. LIST (A1, A2 & A3)

- a) TWELVE years active experience in the Breed (waived in the case of all rounders).
- b) To have judged seventy-five classes of Afghans at open show level spanning a minimum period of seven years.
- c) To have judged both sexes separately at an Afghan Hound Breed Club show or Breed Club sponsored show.
- d) To have judged a minimum of 150 Afghan Hounds
- e) To have bred or owned a minimum of three dogs when obtained their 1st entry into the KC Stud Book (save in exceptional cases) **or** alternatively owned two Afghans in the Stud Book plus an additional fifty classes of Afghans, this to include a further ten class Breed show.
- f) One of the two Club shows must be balloted.
- g) To have stewarded at not less than twelve shows.
- h) To have passed a recognised Breed Club examination **OR** to have been active in the Breed prior to 1968, and to have awarded five sets of Challenge Certificates in the British Isles.
- i) To have been previously approved by the KC to award CCs and to have completed their first appointment.

A3 Only

- h) **To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer, and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures.**
- i) **To have attended a Conformation & Movement 'Hands-on Assessment' conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and to have passed the assessment.**
- j) **To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement.**
- k) **To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable**

ALL ROUNDERS

To have awarded C.C.s in three hound breeds and to have judged a minimum of 150 classes of Afghans at open show level over a minimum period of 5 years.

OVERSEAS JUDGES

Overseas applicants will be judged on their individual merits.

In the case of applications from all rounders to be included on any of the above lists, the necessity of ownership and involvement with Afghans is waived.
